NEW OWNER PLANNING EXTENSIVE CHANGES

Boat Landing and Swimming Pool
Included in Scheme Worked
Out by Mr. Rathbone.

The Estate of Boardman Burchard has sold through Reed Haviland the island known as Hoyt's Island, which consists of about three acres of land and lies directly to the east of Wilson Point, on the easterly side of Village creek.

The buyer is Albert Rathbone, who owns about ten acres at Wilson Point, directly opposite Hoyt's Island and is building a large stone house there.

Mr. Rathbone is planning some very extensive improvements in the way of boat landing and swimming pools, and it is probable that Hoyt's Island will be included in Mr. Rathbone's scheme for improving and beautifying that part of Norwalk harbor.
